Now the latest update on the Proctor Ridge Trails work:

The marking and initial chain saw clearing of the new trails route is now complete and ready for the dozer work which is beginning this week. The Proctor Ridge trail provides access off Spruce Creek Drive—through and along private land (owned by R. Rains and the Gernts) for approximately 2 miles, then into the Park, down to Laurel Creek and connects to the Darrow Ridge/Ridge Top area trails.

# 20th ANNUAL STORYTELLING EVENT SCHEDULED FOR SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 15, 2012.

The Twentieth Annual "Haunting in the Hills" Storytelling Festival will be held Saturday, September 15, in the Big South Fork National River and Recreation Area. The day's events will feature storytelling, craft demonstrations, workshops and sales, afternoon storytelling presentations, an open stage for local and student tellers and performances of dulcimer and bluegrass music. The day will culminate with the evening storytelling session. The event starts at 10AM ET

As in past years, storytellers will visit many area schools during the week before the event. Students will have the opportunity to enjoy the wonderful experience of seeing a professional storyteller perform. They will be encouraged to work with their teachers to develop their own stories to present during the open stage session on Saturday.

The climax of this year's festival will again be the night of ghost stories. Five storytellers from around the country will present their best ghost stories beginning at 8:00 p.m. EDT. A series of "not-too-scary" stories will first be presented for the young and faint of heart. These will be followed by very scary stories for those brave enough to stay.

Neighbors and visitors alike are encouraged to come spend a special day at the Big South Fork National River and Recreation Area. Please remember to dress appropriately for the weather, bring a flashlight, a blanket for seating on the ground, and snacks or drinks. Food will be available for sale through on site vendors. Parking for the event will be in the field across the road from the Bandy Creek Visitor Center near the pool. Bring the entire family and plan on spending the day to enjoy all of the activities.

Temporary Closure of Proctor Ridge Horse Trail

Oneida, Tennessee: The National Park Service, along with volunteers, is in the process of re-routing eroded sections of the Proctor Ridge horse trail in the Big South Fork National River and Recreation Area. During this process, the trail will need to be closed while the work is being performed. This project will improve water quality, ensure better protection to a variety of species that live in the areas streams, and also improve visitor safety.

Beginning September 13, 2012, the Proctor Ridge horse trail that goes from the Darrow Ridge multiple use trail along Proctor Ridge trail to the boundary of Big South Fork NRRA will be closed to public travel from Thursday, September 13, through Friday, October 5, 2012.




Ever wish you could work your horse on an obstacle course?
